CHURCH PLANTING RESIDENCY

If you ask Justin Smith why he left a steady job in a thriving ministry to move to Lubbock for a two-year church planting residency, his answer is simple: because Jesus is Worth It! Justin and his family joined Redeemer this spring to begin the process of church-planting. They are receiving training, casting vision to college students, and praying about planting in a college centered area in 2022.

FAMILY MINISTRY

Our family ministry exists to partner with parents to proclaim the Gospel to children. We were able to serve and connect with families in meaningful ways this spring! After winter weather significantly damaged our kids' wing, we were able to update and renovate to serve families. We also celebrated Easter with an Easter Egg Hunt for kids in our neighborhood, and our church body was honored to come alongside 14 families to dedicate their children to the Lord.

SENDING

At Redeemer, we have yearly rhythms of training members from our church to share their faith locally and take steps to discern their role in the Great Commission globally. This spring, 77 members from our church participated in 10-week Disciple Making Teams, 22 people completed a 9-month training program to learn how to engage cross-culturally and prepare to move overseas, and 6 individuals were commissioned to be sent overseas in the next few months to the unengaged and unreached.




Last fall, if one of my unbelieving friends would have asked me what the gospel was, I would have had nothing.
