## Financial FAQs

#### What is Redeemer's Budget?

Our budget was \$3.4 million for the fiscal year ending July 31, 2022. We are funded entirely through the generous giving of our members and every dollar we spend advances God's mission in Lubbock, in the U.S., and among the unreached around the world. Gifts are contributed throughout the year, but about 20% of our annual giving is received each December.

#### How much of Redeemer's budget goes to Sending?

\$530,000 of general giving (16%) is committed, specifically, to Sending efforts. We also receive occasional gifts designated directly to our Sending fund which vary each year. We were able to share more than \$135,000 of our Sending budget with local and regional partners to support causes like foster care and adoption, pregnancy services, community social services, and church planting.

#### Why don't we "pass the plate" for giving at Redeemer?

We believe the best way to facilitate joyful giving (2 Corinthians 9:7, Matthew 6:4) is by making it as easy and secure as possible. Therefore, we provide opportunities to give as the Lord leads. Anyone can give online, send checks by mail, place gifts in the secure giving boxes in the worship center, or drop off gifts in person at our offices.

#### What was Redeemer's budgeted expense allocation for the 21-22 budget year?

82% of our budget goes directly to Kingdom work, including all weekend and midweek ministries, our staff, local ministry, equipping, and strategic investments in goers and church planting.

18% of our budget goes toward operating and maintaining our facilities, software platforms, and other resources which are used throughout the week.

#### Does Redeemer have any debt?

We do not currently have any debt obligations.

#### How are budgets created, approved, and managed?

With direction from the Executive Elders, each ministry builds its budget from the ground up every year. Directors create plans and goals in alignment with our overall vision, evaluating what we should keep doing, start doing, and stop doing. Proposed budgets are reviewed by our Finance Team (a lay-led advisory team) which provides leadership in our budget planning and implementation. Then, the Full Council of Elders reviews and approves the final budget before it is operationalized.

We have rigorous processes to track every dollar in and out of Redeemer, with monthly reporting for each department. Additionally, the Finance Team reviews our monthly financials and provides insight and recommendations throughout the year.

#### How did the budget change from last year (20-21)?

Our 21'-22' and 20'-21' budget years looked very similar due to the fact that the Worth It initiative spanned a two year time period. Historically, we project growth at about 8-10% each year. However, for our 22'-23' budget we conservatively projected a 3% increase in giving based on the previous two years of flat, or slightly decreased, giving trends.

#### How has COVID-19 impacted Redeemer's budget and giving?

Simply put, we have reviewed all ministry strategies and budgets to appropriately right-size them, especially in light of the economic challenges brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. Our conservative spending practices and solid fiscal management have helped us avoid any significant unplanned budget reductions.

To date, giving has been slightly decreased, ending the 21'-22' budget year at 92% of the projected giving. Thank you for your continued generosity, and please pray with us that God will meet our needs.

#### How does Redeemer prepare for the unexpected?

We maintain a balanced level of reserves to manage liquidity in all seasons. At the direction of our Finance Team and in accordance with industry best practices we maintain cash reserves to cover a minimum of three months operating expenses. We believe this lets us put resources to work to accomplish our mission while safeguarding against "rainy day" scenarios. In addition to our minimum reserves, we often build up additional reserves ahead of major planned projects and expenses.
